

RESOLUTION NO. 70-144

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
COUNTY OF SHASTA ACTIVATING THE SHASTA COUNTY
AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, this Board has heretofore called a hearing for Monday, September 28, 1970, at 3:30 P. M. to consider the need to activate the Air Pollution Control District within this County pursuant to Health and Safety Code Sections 24198, et seq., and

WHEREAS, at said hearing evidence was received on the need for such District from all interested persons, including the Health Department of the County of Shasta,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it is the finding of this Board based upon evidence received at said public hearing that:

- (a) The air within this County is likely to become so polluted with air contaminants as to be injurious to health, an obstruction to the free use of property and offensive to the senses of a considerable number of persons, all which will interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property;
- (b) It is not practicable to rely upon the enactment or enforcement of local County and City ordinances to prevent or control the emission of smoke, fumes or other substances which cause or contribute to such pollution;

and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based upon the foregoing findings, this Board hereby declares that there is need for an

Air Pollution Control District to function in this County, which District shall be known as the Shasta County Air Pollution Control District.
