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RECOMMENDATION

Receive a presentation from the Air Pollution Control Officer regarding the jurisdictional responsibility of the Shasta County Air Quality Management District and the Shasta County Air Pollution Control Board.

DISCUSSION

The Shasta County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) was activated by Shasta County Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 70-144, adopted September 28, 1970. It was later changed from the APCD to the Shasta County Air Quality Management District (AQMD) by the Air Pollution Control Board (APCB) Resolution No. 86-2, adopted July 22, 1986. The administrative support functions of the APCD/AQMD originated with Public Health but was later transferred to Environmental Health during the September 18, 1990, APCB meeting. The administrative support functions of the AQMD were eventually transferred to the Department of Resource Management after a reorganization and restructure of County government. This transfer of the AQMD administrative support functions was by APCB Resolution No. 92-7, adopted May 5, 1992.

During the February 4, 2025, APCB meeting, the Board directed staff to come back with a presentation regarding the jurisdictional responsibility of the AQMD/APCB. Staff will present a brief history and will outline the rules and regulations of the AQMD as well as answer questions from the Board.
