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RECOMMENDATION

Take the following actions: (1) Open a public hearing; (2) close the public hearing; and (3) adopt a resolution which finds the previously relinquished access rights (Access Rights) onto Bear Mountain Road (County Road No. 5H04) and specifically identified in the Legal Description attached to the Resolution submitted herewith, are not necessary for current or future public use and orders the vacation of the Access Rights.

DISCUSSION

A local property owner, Mario Callegari (Owner), has petitioned the Board of Supervisors to abandon a portion of relinquished Access Rights onto Bear Mountain Road (County Road No. 5H04). The Access Rights were dedicated on Tract Map No. 1922 filed on June 26, 2006, in Book 24 Recorded Maps at Page 4, Shasta County Records. The Owner currently utilizes the Access Rights as access to the southerly portion of his parcel and is in the process of obtaining a building permit to build a shop in the southerly portion of his parcel. The abandonment of the Access Rights would provide access to the planned improvements.

The Public Works Director has determined the abandonment to be minor in nature, as it is no longer needed for street widening or alignment projects, as per Resolution No. 83-271. The abandonment is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), as this is not a Public Works Project. Public hearing notices were published and posted in accordance with Streets & Highways Code Sections 8322 & 8323.

ALTERNATIVES

The Board may decline to abandon the Access Rights. The Owner would be unable to continue with their planned improvements.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT

County Counsel has approved the resolution and public notice as to form. The recommendation has been reviewed by the County Administrative Office.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no General Fund impact as a result of the recommended actions. Sufficient appropriations are included in the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Roads Budget for the abandonment process. Abandonment fee revenue from the petitioner covers all costs.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

ORDERING THE VACATION OF RELINQUISHED ACCESS RIGHTS
ALONG BEAR MOUNTAIN ROAD (COUNTY ROAD NO. 5H04)
IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF SHASTA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA**

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has been petitioned to abandon the relinquishment of access rights to Bear Mountain Road (County Road No. 5H04) in the unincorporated area of Shasta County; and

WHEREAS, the relinquishment of access rights to Bear Mountain Road (County Road No. 5H04) proposed to be vacated is more specifically described in Exhibits “A1” and “A2”, attached hereto and incorporated herein (the “Property”); and

WHEREAS, the Property was dedicated on Tract Map No. 1922, filed on June 26, 2006 in Book 24 of Maps at Page 4, Shasta County Records; and

WHEREAS, Section 8320 et seq. of the Streets and Highways Code authorizes the Board of Supervisors to vacate public streets, highways, service easements, and access rights; and

WHEREAS, Section 65402(a) of the Government Code provides that no real property shall be acquired or disposed of until the planning agency has made a general plan consistency finding; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 83-271 provides that the acquisition, disposition or abandonment of real property for street widening or alignment projects and the disposition of the remainder of a larger parcel which was acquired and used in part for street purposes are exempt from general plan consistency findings when the Director of Public Works finds that such actions are minor in nature; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 65402(a) and the authority set forth in Resolution No. 83-271, the Director of Public Works has determined the abandonment to be minor in nature and thereby exempt from a general plan consistency analysis; and

WHEREAS, notice of the hearing was published and posted in accordance with the procedures contained in Sections 8322 and 8323 of the Streets and Highways Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors heard and considered all written and oral evidence offered to be considered at the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds, based on the evidence presented, that the Property is unnecessary for present or prospective public use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Property is unnecessary for present or prospective public use, and from and after the date this Resolution is recorded, the Property is hereby vacated and access rights to Bear Mountain Road (County Road No. 5H04) restored.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Board shall cause a certified copy of this Resolution to be recorded in accordance with Streets and Highways Code Section 8325.




